NHCS Second Semester 2020-2021 Attendance Expectations

AA/BB Face-to Face

Attendance will be taken Monday/Tuesday & Thursday/Friday based on attendance in students' in-person classes. Students not attending assigned in-person classes will be marked absent.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can my child work remotely if scheduled face-to face days?

Yes. But if they are scheduled to be at school that day, they will be marked absent.

What if my AA/BB child is quarantined due to exposure to COVID-19?

AA/BB students under quarantine per the school nurse will be given the opportunity to work remotely.

What percentage of the school day does my child need to attend (remotely or face-to-face) to be counted present?

This policy has not changed. Students need to be present 50% of the day to be counted present (Middle School is 2/4 core classes). If a partial school day is missed, students must complete missed assignments

Do I need to send a note if my child is absent?

Yes. All absences, face-to-face or remote, need to be communicated to the teacher. If your child is going to miss instruction, please inform the school.

AA/BB Remote and Full Remote Learning

Attendance will be taken Monday –Friday based on a students' attendance in synchronous and asynchronous learning (AA/BB students 3 days/week). Students not attending Zoom classes and not completing asynchronous assignments will be marked absent.

How can I be counted present while remote?

Synchronous Instruction

- ✓ Participate the entirety of the Zoom lesson
- ✓ Complete the work assigned during the Zoom

Asynchronous Instruction

✓ Complete the assignment the day it is assigned or by the due date.

Virtual Academy

Attendance will be taken Monday-Friday based on a students' log-in and work completion. Daily logins to each class are expected. Those not logging and completing work will be counted absent.

How can I be counted present?

- ✓ Log-in and complete work Monday-Friday
- ✓ Complete assignments by the due date
